A **page** or **webpage** is a [document](#) or [information resource](#) that is suitable for [the Wide Web](#) and can be accessed through a [web browser](#) and displayed on [a monitor](#) or [mobile device](#). This information is usually in [HTML](#) or [XHTML](#), and may provide [navigation](#) to other web pages via [hypertext links](#). Web pages frequently subsume other resources such as [style sheets](#), [scripts](#) and [images](#) into their final presentation.

ages may be retrieved from a local computer or from a remote web server. A web server may restrict access only to a private network, e.g. a corporate network, or it may publish pages on the World Wide Web. Web pages are created and served from web servers using [Hypertext Transfer Protocol \(HTTP\)](#).

ages may consist of files of static text and other [content](#) stored within the server's file system ([static web pages](#)), or may be constructed by [server-side](#) [scripting](#) when they are requested ([dynamic web pages](#)). Client-side [scripting](#) can make web pages more responsive to user input once on the client browser.
